General Conference 2024



Every four years, United Methodists from around the world gather for a General Conference that will chart the denomination's future.

For the past three years, GC planning has been hampered by the COVID pandemic and resulting travel complications — leading the commission to postpone General Conference three times. The assembly, originally planned for 2020 in Minneapolis, is now scheduled for April 23-May 3, 2024, in Charlotte, North Carolina.

The coming General Conference is to have 862 voting delegates — 55.9% from the U.S., 32% from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church. Half are to be clergy and half laity. Bishops preside at General Conference sessions but do not have a vote. The Michigan Annual Conference is sending 8 elected delegates. More than 1,000 legislative petitions, aiming to shape the denomination's future, will be before the lay and clergy delegates. Details of that legislation can be found at umnews.org, and a printed summary is available at the church.

On many people's minds is the division along theological lines in the denomination, primarily regarding the UMC's stance on LGBTQ+ inclusion (same-sex marriage, ordination, and church membership, to summarize). There were plans to discuss terms of separation at the 2020 General Conference, and much of that legislation will still go before the delegates at the 2024 gathering. However, given that General Conference has been delayed, a separation of sorts already has taken place. Over the past four years, the denomination has seen nearly 7,700 U.S. churches — about a quarter of its U.S. congregations — disaffiliate under a policy approved by the 2019 special General Conference that expired at the end of 2023.

The disaffiliation policy in the Discipline's Paragraph 2553, allowed churches to leave with property "for reasons of conscience" related to homosexuality, if they met certain financial and procedural obligations. The coming General Conference will see petitions to extend Paragraph 2553, so that it can continue to apply in the U.S. and expand to churches in the central conferences. Other petitions seek to enable whole U.S. annual conferences to leave or make it easier for annual conferences in Africa, Europe and the Philippines to do so.

In our Michigan Annual Conference, 84% of churches remain United Methodist, with 126 churches disaffiliating to either join another denomination or exist independently. A full report of these statistics can be found at **michiganumc.org**.

Here at Allegan UMC, there has been no interest among the Administrative Board to explore disaffiliation, and not enough interest voiced from the congregation for them to do so. One common misconception was that a church had to vote to *remain* United Methodist when, in fact, a vote is *only* needed if a congregation wants to disaffiliate. Those churches wishing to remain don't need to take any action to do so. As Heather Hahn, of UM News reported: "Even with so many decisions before delegates, Council of Bishops President Bickerton stressed that General Conference is no simple business meeting. Instead, he urged viewers to see this as "a convening of the Body of Christ to discern the will of God for the future of the church we love."

We invite you to hold our delegates in your prayers, as they do their work!

What wondrous love He has for us as He laid down His life for us that we might have life eternal. We were not there when He was crucified, we were not there when they nailed Him to the cross, we were not there when they laid Him in the tomb, and we were not there when the stone was rolled away. We know that on the third day He did rise from the dead and that keeps us believing in Him and in His word. As we celebrate "Christ the Lord is Risen Today," and know that "Every Morning is Easter Morning," and know "He Lives," we are blessed beyond measure.

2024 Advocacy Day

Nearly 250 people attended Advocacy Day held at the State Capitol including Sari Hammon, Pastor Julia, and Cindy Thiele. Believing that health care is a basic human right, advocacy for increased access to care, and eradicate stigma around treatment of mental health and substance use disorder treatment was the theme. This was a well-planned event with appointment times to meet with one's Senator or Representative, a press conference, box lunch, worship, and tours of a Capitol.

We asked Michigan legislators to pass House Bill 4707 -to expend health insurance to cover mental health and House Bills 5371 and 5372 to codify Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics in state law (think of the On Point clinic, located at 540 Jenner Dr., Allegan) and funding for those clinics.

Financial Corner - March 2024

The Finance team worked very hard to put the 2024 Budget Plan together, thank you for your suggestions and ideas. As you can see the below balances as of the end of February, we are trending in the positive direction.

February 2024 Balances:

General Fund = \$29,607

Trustee Fund = \$30,169

Food Pantry = \$8,995

Memorial Fund = \$7,537

Mutual Fund = \$116,408

The Finance team, along with the Administrative Board has determined to pool their efforts for Fundraisers for 2024 and all money from the two big events will go to the Trustees for the replacement of the Sanctuary roof. The two events will be:

- 1) Garage Sale on Saturday May 4th
- 2) Dinner and Live Auction Fall of 2024. More on this later. (Tentative dates are Nov 2 or 9)

Our Goal from these two fundraisers is \$10,000.

The General Fund will receive the proceeds from the Ag/Bake/Craft table – Goal \$2,253

- 1) The Ag/Bake/Craft table will continue this summer starting on Sunday May 26.


