#### **GATEWAY MISSION**

Impacting Our Homeless & Hurting Neighbors

No one imagines they could end up homeless or living on the streets, but it can happen to anyone. A health scare, lost job, domestic abuse, addiction, rising living costs ...these can all be visible causes of homelessness. Without the right tools and worldview, a life crisis can be much worse than a difficult season; it can leave a person in desperate need.

For over 120 years, Gateway Mission has served our community most vulnerable neighbors by meeting their immediate needs and providing hope and tools to transform their lives. Such as: Shelter Programs: They provide a Men's Center and Women & Children Center to meet urgent needs and provide Long-term assistance.

Gateway Forge Program: Assists guests with drug and alcohol abuse, past criminal history or continued occupational and housing barriers. This is a 40-week program.

**Gateway Store:** The Gateway Store provides opportunities for their program students to work alongside staff and volunteers to sort, process and stage goods for customers to purchase.

Gateway Spoon (Good Food for a Good Cause): Gateway Spoon Café and Grill opened in early October 2023. Gateway graduates learn culinary arts from professionals. Graduates earn chef credentials and achieve certifications. The menu provides healthy wholesome meals with certain items coming from local farmers.
