ALLEGAN COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION Dolly Parton Imagination Library

Dolly Parton Imagination Library (DPIL) sends one book per month to a child aged 0-5. In Allegan County the Foundation are the DPIL Affiliate. They (ACCF) took this over in October 2023 a United Way had decided to stop supporting the program. ACCF saw the value in supporting early literacy in a county that has a high percentage of adults that have not completed high school/GED and how that correlate to generational poverty. It costs \$2.80/month per child or \$33.60/year or \$168 to sponsor a child for the full five

years. You can see how even a small church can have an impact!

When the child enters the program they get a welcome book, then every month they receive a new book. There is a panel of educators on the DPIL Board that selects the books. When they are ready to "graduate" on their 5th birthday, they receive another special book. In total, a child will receive up to 60 books. They are mailed directly to the child each month – which is a double delight – a new book AND mail! Their parents also receive a quarterly email from our partners at Allegan Area ESA about how to support early literacy at home. It is a great program, and we are happy that it did not go away in Allegan County!

FYI--The foundation supports a lot of organizations – 18 food pantries, 1 food club and nearly 40 other organizations this year – in addition to over 100 students that are receiving scholarships from them.

HELP—The Foundation is also looking for volunteers to help build shelves in their basement. The lumber will be supplied.




