- Plaster repair for the interior ( will be looked at, after we ensure the water leaks are resolved)

# Financial Corner - September 2024

The Finance team continues to work very hard towards the 2024 Budget and has plans for a Lasagna Dinner and Live and Silent Auction for Saturday November 9.

The Dinner will consist of Lasagna, salad, garlic or cheese bread, desert and drink. Live Auction and Silent auction will follow the lasagna dinner. Signup sheets will be going up soon for people to donate items for the Auctions. The dinner will be from 5:00 pm – 7:00pm. Auctions will start at approximately 7:00pm. All money from this big event will also go to the Trustees for the replacement of the Sanctuary roof. Goal for this event is \$5,000.

Workers are needed for the Lasagna Dinner; there will be a signup sheet up soon for this event.

The Ag/Bake/Craft table has a Goal of \$2,253 this year. As of September 24, 2024 we are a little over \$2,000. The Table will continue for a couple more weeks.

August 2024 Balances:

The Trustees Fund has had the \$20,000 moved into it since the month end of August from the Mutual Funds. The above number in the Mutual Fund is accurate with the \$20,000 removed. The balance in the Trustee Fund after paying \$52,637 to Priority Roofing is in early September is \$22,503. This \$20,000 from the Mutual Fund will be paid back to the Mutual fund in \$5,000 increments over time.

The Trustee Committee is now looking into repairs in the Sanctuary; this is why we will not be paying anything yet back to the Mutual Fund.

CHURCH WORLD SERVICE BLANKETS & TOOLS PROGRAM

The CWS Blankets program offers comfort and security to those who may not have a safe place to live or to sleep. Besides blankets the program offers: Hygiene Kits, School Kits,

Welcome Backpack, Period Pack/Menstrual Hygiene Kit, and Emergency Cleanup Buckets.

UMCOR and CWS: Many had to leave Ukraine due to explosions near their homes. One person contacted Church World Service staff in Moldova and said: "I realized that the most important thing was my son and that we had to leave." Hundreds of thousands of people from Ukraine who have made their way over the border to Moldova, which is a fraction of the size of its much larger neighbor. Moldova is one of the poorest countries in Europe, and being close by, receive Ukrainians who cannot afford to travel any farther.

At the CWS refugee hub in Bali, refugees can pick up food and hygiene supplies, get medical or mental health support and connect to other available services.

Funds supporting CWS will help all these refugees and more.
