

Courageous Conversations Events

At the 2024 General Conference, discriminatory language was removed from the United Methodist Book of Discipline that previously forbid the ordination of LGBTQ clergy as well as imposed penalties on UM Churches who hosted same-sex weddings, and UM pastors who officiated said weddings. The result is that now local UM churches are free to choose how they want to engage in these

changes, without any penalties one way or the other.

Which leaves Allegan UMC with some questions to consider:

- If the church was waiting for a new pastor, and the District Superintendent or Bishop's
 Cabinet called SPRC and said "We have a qualified pastor for you, they are
 gay/lesbian/trans, is Allegan UMC open to receiving them as their pastor?" What answer
 would Allegan UMC give?
- If a same-sex couple contacted the pastor and said: "We would like to get married and are looking for a church venue, is yours available?" What answer would Allegan UMC wish the pastor to give?

These are all questions that would benefit having well thought-out answers in advance, and it's clear that AUMC may not be all of the same mind on what those answers might be.

However, before any decision is made, before any surveys given or votes taken, we must first learn how to talk with one another on this subject.

That is why we will be holding two "Courageous Conversations Events". One in November 2024 and one in January 2025.

What is Courageous Conversations? CC is a intentional, guided conversation even, highly structured by a curriculum, that fosters and encourages vulnerable, honest, and grace-filled conversation about difficult topics in congregational settings. It's meant to teach folks how to talk about things they may disagree about, and in the process hopefully build compassion and trust in the church family, despite differences of opinion. We learn how to talk to one another in love, and hear about one another's experiences.

(If you Google "Courageous Conversations UMC" you will find introductions and further information on this program.

What ISN'T Courageous Conversations? CC isn't a debate, it isn't a time to convince anyone of anything, or decide anything. The carefully structured curriculum in place to prevent diatribes, lectures, or arguments.

<u>Financial Corner - November 2024</u>

The Finance team would like to announce the plans for the 2025 Stewardship program. This year we are planning the:

Say Yes -The Power of Generosity – This program will be the four Sundays in November with the actual Pledge Date of Sunday December 1. These Sermons will very insightful and interesting and hopefully make us all think about Generosity.

There will be two Sundays in November where members of our church will speak for a couple of minutes about their involvement with the Church.

On Sunday November 24 – members of the Finance team will stay after the service to answer question from the congregation – while "Hanging the Greens".

The week of November 11 a letter and Pledge cards will be mailed to the congregation.

The Finance team continues to work very hard towards the 2024 Budget and has plans for a Lasagna Dinner and Live and Silent Auction for Saturday November 9.

The Dinner will consist of Lasagna, salad, garlic or cheese bread, desert and drink. Live Auction and Silent auction will follow the lasagna dinner. Signup sheets are up for people to donate items for the Auctions. The dinner will be from 5:00 pm – 7:00pm. Auctions will start at approximately 7:00pm. All money from this big event will also go to the Trustees for the replacement of the Sanctuary roof. Goal for this event is \$5,000.

The Ag/Bake/Craft table has a Goal of \$2,253 this year. We exceeded our goal with \$2,404 – thank you to all of you for making this happen.

September 2024 Balances:

General Fund = \$27,953

Trustee Fund = \$23,019

Food Pantry = \$1,726

Memorial Fund = \$8,919

Mutual Fund = \$106,214

The Trustees Fund has reduced significantly as they paid the Roof replacement invoice \$52,637. The \$20,000 from the Mutual Fund will be paid back to the Mutual fund in \$5,000 increments over time.

The Trustee Committee is now looking into repairs in the Sanctuary; they hope to have quotes soon.

Financial Update 9/30/2024 2023 vs 2024

To date this has a very good year for AUMC. Thank you all very much for your generosity!

- In 2023 we had \$9,000 in fund raisers that all went toward our General Operation expenses. However, in 2024 most all our fund raising went to the Trustee's Account and their much-needed roof replacement project.
- The one 2024 General Fund fundraiser, the Ag/Bake table, made \$700 (40%) more in 2024 than in 2023.
- In 2024, we were blessed with a \$5,000 equitable compensation grant by the conference to help pay pastor compensation costs.
- To date in 2024, pledge gifts from our congregation have exceeded 2023 giving's by \$24,000 (16%).
 Thank you so much!
- Saving on expenses has been goal for our team. We have reduced expenses \$5,000 YTD (3.6%) versus 2023.

Thanks again as we hope to keep the trend going. Closing the year and Advent season out on a positive note!


