

Courageous Conversations Event - 2nd Opportunity!

If you missed your chance to attend November's Courageous Conversations event, or if you'd like to participate in it again, here's your chance!

- Next event will be held on January 11th, 12noon-3pm, with food/refreshments provided.
- Sign-up sheet can be found in the Fellowship Hall. While it is not required to attend, it greatly helps organizers plan for the event!
- This event is <u>not</u> open to the general public only to members, constituents, and/or regular attendees
 of Allegan UMC.

What is Courageous Conversations? It's an intentional, guided, discussion-based event, that fosters and encourages vulnerable, honest, and grace-filled conversation about difficult topics in congregational settings. It's meant to teach folks how to talk, and give everyone equal space to talk, about things they may disagree about. This process seeks to build compassion and trust in a church family, despite differences of opinion. You get a chance to share your experiences and perspective, while learning about others as well.

What ISN'T Courageous Conversations? It <u>isn't</u> a debate, it isn't a time to convince anyone of anything, or decide anything. The carefully structured curriculum in place to prevent diatribes, lectures, or arguments.

Why are we doing this?

At the 2024 General Conference, discriminatory language was removed from the United Methodist Book of Discipline that *previously* forbid the ordination of LGBT+ clergy, as well as imposed penalties on UM Churches who hosted same-sex weddings and UM pastors who officiated said weddings. The result is that now local UM churches are free to choose how they want to engage in these changes, without any penalties one way or the other.

Which leaves Allegan UMC with some questions to consider:

- If the church was waiting for a new pastor, and the District Superintendent or Bishop's
 Cabinet called SPRC and said "We have a qualified pastor for you, they are
 gay/lesbian/trans, is Allegan UMC open to receiving them as their pastor?" What answer
 would you want Allegan UMC to give?
- If a same-sex couple contacted the pastor and said: "We would like to get married and are looking for a church venue, is yours available?" What answer would Allegan UMC wish the pastor to give?

These are all questions that would benefit having well thought-out answers in advance, and it's clear that AUMC may not be all of the same mind on what those answers might be.

However, before any decision is made, we must first learn how to talk with one another on this subject. **Please join us for this event!**


