May is also the month we honor our mothers and mine has been gone for 42 years but not a day goes by that I don't find myself seeing her in me. She was a stay-at-home mom to us 4 kids and she suffered a lot of heartache in her life. Her mother died when she was 9 and she and her siblings were split up. She married my dad and gave birth to 7 children 3 of which died at young ages. My oldest brother drowned at the age of 11, my sister died of Meningitis at the age of 3, and another baby boy died at birth. So 4 of us grew to be adults but, sadly, I am the only one left. She was the heart of our home as she showed her love for us by everything she did, everything she said, and everything she taught us. She made the best sack lunches and would always add a

personal touch like radish roses, little notes, and 1 Lifesaver. She worked hard around our home but she always had time to help us with our school work and made it fun. I still spell geography, in my head, like she taught me: George Edwards old grandfather rode a pig home yesterday! Her cooking was amazing and I have yet to duplicate some of her recipes as she kept them in her head. We were not a church going family but every Sunday she would put us on a bus to attend Sunday School at the Open Bible Church. I am the only one of us who continued to attend church throughout my life. When we moved to Wyoming MI, I attended an elementary school that had a church meeting there so I was able to walk there on my own. It so happens that the church was Methodist and Rev. Hutchens was the pastor and he became my pastor again here in Allegan. I do believe my mom was a believer, maybe she didn't speak about it, but she lived it. She was a fun-loving Grandma and all the grandkids had fun with Grandma Guppy. She died at the age of 70, which has been too long for me to not have my mom with me. However, she is still with me in my heart, soul, mind, and spirit as she was the best mom ever! You who still have your moms treasure them because when they are gone they take a piece of you with them.

#### Michigan after the Storm


This nonprofit organization launched by the Michigan Conference of the United Methodist Church in 2022. It provides Disaster Case Management which is a client-centered approach to assisting survivors of natural disasters achieve their long-term recovery goals.

The After the Storm's team that comes in once initial emergency responders are gone and walk alongside individuals and families as they come to terms with the damage and begin to rebuild their lives. After the Storm, has quickly grown to be the expert in long-term disaster response and recovery here in Michigan, trusted by federal, state, and local partners.

One area that they have helped with: Kalamazoo Tornado Disaster Recovery After the Storm is providing Disaster Case Management services in Kalamazoo County following the EF2 tornado that struck on May 7, 2024.

they come to the servers who provide the food. 3- Load Food cart on to the elevator The families will then take the cart and load their car.



<u>Van driver</u>: Pick up food from local distribution warehouse here in Allegan. Must feel comfortable in driving a cargo van. No special license is required.


