No matter the threat teachers, staff, and the children should not have to worry about someone coming into their school and hurting people. There is so much violence and evil in our world it's overwhelming but we know we have to continue to pray that somehow, someway we can overcome the violence and evil. I think about the hymn "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" where it tells about how He is a bulwark never failing. He is our helper against the ancient foes, He is the right man on our side and He will win the battle!

Lord, as we begin another school year we need to put on the full armor of God and protect those whom we love from acts of violence and evil. Our prayer should be that no other child, teacher, staff, or family should have to grieve over the loss or injury of a loved one. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayers.
